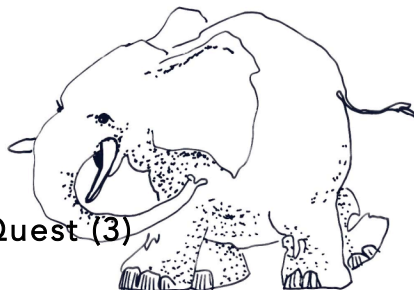
Pachyderms (2)
